**COUNCIL BUSINESS:** At the September 10, 2013 meeting, the Council:

- Continued its discussion of the Water Department's recent pump problems with Water Department Supervisor Bob Durr. Mr. Durr presented the Council with several options for repairing or replacing the pump and the lead time for each. It was the Council's consensus to wait and replace the current pump when it fails with a model that is readily available from a local vendor.
- Passed Ordinance No. 406 adopting a Six-Year Transportation Improvement Plan for 2014 through 2019. This plan outlines the Town's schedule for road repairs for the period.
- Adopted Resolution No. 285 authorizing the Mayor to execute an Agreement with the Eastside Transportation Partnership (ETP) for 2013 – 2015. The Town has participated in the ETP since 1995. Participation gives us a voice in regional transportation planning.
- Postponed further discussion of security cameras until October, when Town Marshal Scott expects to have the additional information requested by the Council in June.

**NEXT COUNCIL MEETING:** The next regular meeting of the Town Council will be held at **7:00pm on Tuesday, October 8, 2013** at Tom Stowe's house. The Council will hold it's first of two monthly public hearings to discuss the 2014 Budget.

**MARSHAL REPORT:** I will discuss at the Council meeting this month, the "Virtual Gated Community" project and give further presentation concerning the efficiency of the proposed camera system for identification and conviction of crimes.

**FIRE PREVENTION WEEK:** The Bellevue Fire Department will get Fire Prevention Week off to a blazing start with its popular open houses on Saturday, October 5, 2013, 10am-4pm. As usual during the annual kickoff event to national Fire Prevention Week (Oct. 6-12), all nine Bellevue fire stations will be open to the public so residents can meet the firefighters who protect their neighborhoods. During Fire Prevention Week, firefighters also will visit schools and do readings at libraries. The Fire Dept. closest to Beaux Arts is on Bellevue Way, near the Bellevue Nursery.

**LIGHT RAIL EASTLINK STATION BRAINSTORMING:** See last page for details, coming up on Thursday, October 10, 2013, 7:00pm at Enatai Elementary, for your chance to weigh in on the new EastLink Station for Light Rail that will be built at the South Bellevue Park and Ride.

**RECYCLING COLLECTION DAY:** King County Solid Waste and Bellevue Utilities have teamed up with the surrounding communities to bring a Recycling Collection event to the Eastside. **STORMWATER DRAINS:** With the stormy fall weather coming, please remember to regularly check and clear the town storm drains in the street near your home. If you have trouble doing that or need assistance, please notify Deputy Clerk Kulp.

**TOWN FALL CLEANUP:** The Town's annual fall Right of Way Street and path cleanup will be coming up this fall, on a Saturday yet to be determined. Dumpsters will be distributed throughout the town streets for town cleanup use that weekend. **SOUND TRANSIT-EAST LINK PROJECT UPDATE:** Open house recaps: On September 10, 2013 about 95 people gathered at the Highland Community Center for an update on final design progress in the Bel-Red corridor. On September 12, 2013 another 65 people joined the East Link Extension team to kickoff final design in Seattle. The meetings generated a lot of good feedback that will help the project team as the East Link Extension moves forward. As the contractor moves off site, fences will remain in place around the new lawn and planting areas to protect them during the establishment period.

# BRAINSTORMING WORKSHOP

Light rail is coming to your neighborhood. Whether you are excited or uncertain about light rail, the City of Bellevue and the Enatai Neighborhood Association **want to hear your ideas** about how to make the most of the East Link station that will be at the South Bellevue Park-and-Ride.

The City is hosting a Brainstorming Workshop

- Enatai Elementary School

- Open house begins at 6:30 pm
- Brainstorming workshop begins at 7 pm

**Workshop participants will identify community concerns and aspirations**, as well as potential approaches to respond to them. These ideas will form the basis for Station Area Planning—a City of Bellevue program separate from the Sound Transit station design work—to prepare for the addition of a light rail station to the area.

**Small samples of comments we have heard so far include:**

- Increase the ease and safety of the walk from my house to the station
- Prevent people from parking in the neighborhood and walking to the station
- Deter vehicles from driving through the neighborhood to avoid traffic on Bellevue Way

**It is important to note that this Station Area Plan *does not* include:**

- Rezoning property – it will *not* be considered
- Parking garage design or mitigation – this will be reviewed through the city permit process
