“Marine Police”: BAV employs King County Marine [“KCSO”] to patrol its 1100 feet of Lake Washington out to the center of the channel [“BAV jurisdiction”]. Mercer Island patrols from the center to its shores [M.I. jurisdiction]. Officially, boater safety is the goal. In enforcing safety rules, both are permitted to write boater's tickets enforcing rules where offenses occur in water territory **only** where it has jurisdiction. *We'd like to learn about BAV resident's experiences with water safety rules enforcement in Lake Washington.* Is KCSO doing a good job? EASTBOUND I-90 OFF-RAMP TO BELLEVUE WAY: As part of the WSDOT/Sound Transit project to add Transit and HOV lanes on I-90, the eastbound off-ramp from I-90 to Bellevue Way will be closed for 15 days beginning September 8th. Third place went to Tom Stowe with Hayley Stowe, Susan Bogert, Dave Rinn, and Rob Carlson as crew. Fourth place went to Eric Ayrault with Charlie Fratt and Cora Pirzio-Biroli as crew. Fifth place went to Selig Leyser with his daughter Lauren, wife Maureen, and Alan Lubner as crew. BARF wishes to thank Ethan Ayrault who did an excellent job as our Commodore this year. The fleet set a new record of 34 races in a single season, beating last season's 33 races. After a blistering start to the 2014 racing season with four races a night the pace settled down to three races each night before the late summer doldrums, but the final night saw great wind and eleven boats participated. Out of our 18 boat fleet 17 boats sailed at least once during the season with an average of nine boats racing each night. BARF sails the Coronado 15 (C-15), a fifteen foot, one-design sailboat with a main and jib, and a crew of two. To qualify for season trophies, boats must have participated in 20 or more races. This season there were nine qualifying boats, right at the average for the past several seasons. Standings are based on the ongoing tally of race results, with the seven highest scores thrown out this season. The fleet races every Wednesday night from the first of June through the end of August. The first race began at 6:30 PM, and could be best seen at the north docks off Pier C. BARF anticipates having a winter meeting to discuss the upcoming 2015 season, so look for the announcement. Our goal is to make all the boats in the fleet competitive, get as much participation from all age groups as possible, increase the skill levels of all participants, and have fun! – Tom Stowe
