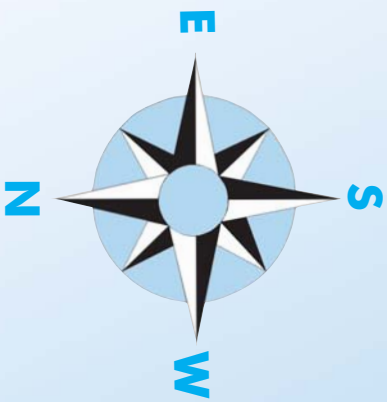

Enter from West on SE 37th

Directions from 405: Heading North or South on I-405, take the I-90 EAST exit. Heading EAST on I-90, take exit 11A -- 150th Ave SE/156th Ave SE. Keep RIGHT to head toward 150th Ave. SE / SE 37th St. At the light, go straight through the intersection to get onto SE 37th St. Bear right to stay on SE 37th St. Follow SE 37th St to the end of the dead end and continue into the Church parking lot.

Only the Following Items Will be Accepted.....

Television Sets

TV sets with 36 inch or smaller screens and encased in plastic - \$20 charge (cash only). TV sets with larger than 36 inch screens, wood console, sets encased in wood, and big screen TV sets - \$25 charge (cash only). Projection TV sets - \$30 charge (cash only). **However, you can recycle your TV set for free - see the E-Cycle box for more information.**

Computer Monitors

A \$10 (cash only) fee will be charged for each monitor. **However, you can recycle your computer monitor for free - see the E-Cycle box for more information.**



Electronic Equipment

DVD players, VCRs, stereo equipment, printers, copiers, fax machines, scanners, cellular phones (**remove personal information**), and computer peripherals such as keyboards and mice. **Beware, it is always a good idea to remove all personal information from any item you are recycling - better safe than sorry.**

Appliances & Scrap Metal

Stoves, microwaves, washers, dryers, other appliances, metal push and gas lawnmowers (drained of oil and gasoline), auto parts, metal lawn chairs, barbecues, iron, steel, aluminum, brass, copper and other ferrous and non-ferrous metals free of charge. Electric lawnmowers are accepted as long as the batteries are removed. A \$10 (cash only) fee will be charged for each refrigerator or freezer brought to the event. A \$5 (cash only) fee will be charged for each water heater that still has insulation coating. No containers that previously or currently contain gas, oil, chemicals or paint will be accepted.

Secure Shredding of Confidential Materials

Shredding and recycling services for confidential papers. Limit 5 file-sized boxes (12x15 inches) - no exceptions.

Household Batteries (not accepted)

Due to high collection costs, household batteries are no longer accepted. Household batteries are collected through the **Factoria Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Service** - <http://www.lhwmp.org/home/HHW/disposal-locations.aspx#factoria>. Open Tuesday - Friday from 8 am to 4 pm and Saturday - Sunday from 9 am to 5 pm.

Auto Batteries

Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle lead acid type batteries only.

Porcelain Toilets and Sinks

Toilets and sinks will be accepted for a \$10 (cash only) fee. Toilet seats, hardware and base wax rings must be removed.



Textiles and Reusable Household Goods

Clothing and miscellaneous household items in usable condition are accepted. Tax receipts available to donors. NO items in need of repair, carpet, area rugs, or furniture.

Propane Tanks

Residential tanks will be accepted for a \$5 (cash only) fee.

Cardboard

Please flatten. No wax coated cardboard.

Number Six Plastics

Styrofoam hot beverage cups, fast food clam-shell containers, egg cartons, and meat trays; polystyrene clear rigid food containers such as cake domes and hinged salad containers. Look for a #6 on the bottom. No urethane foam material, expanded polypropylene, or foam insulation. Please call 425-452-6932 for a referral.

Mattresses

Mattresses and box springs, any size. **Fee:** \$10 per mattresses and \$10 per box spring (cash only). Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot recycle. No futons. No furniture or frames. No wet or soiled items.

Tires

Bias ply, steel belted, and studded tires accepted. Limit 6 passenger tires per household (18 inches and below) free of charge. \$1.50 charge for each tire on a rim. \$5 charged for each large truck tire and \$15 charged for each truck tire on rim (cash only). No oversized tires accepted.

Styrofoam Blocks and Packing Peanuts

White styrofoam blocks and packing peanuts (any color). **No urethane foam cushions, hot tub covers, expanded polypropylene or foam insulation.** Expanded polystyrene only. Look for the #6 or EPS inside the recycling symbol. **Please keep packing peanuts in box or bag. Materials must be clean and dry.**

Bellevue now offers expanded recycling options at the curb. To schedule a curbside pick-up of large scrap metal items, small appliances, or small electronics (all items must be 2 feet by 2 feet by two feet or smaller and weigh less than 60 pounds), call Republic Services at 425-452-4762.



Washington has a **FREE** recycling program called **E-Cycle Washington** for computers, computer monitors, laptops, and televisions. Visit 1800recycle.wa.gov to find authorized E-Cycle Washington collection locations. You may drop off computers, computer monitors, portable DVD players, televisions, portable or laptop computers including tablet computers, and e-readers (also called e-book readers) for free at the following locations: **Goodwill Bellevue Store (14515 NE 20th St, Bellevue, WA, 98007, 425-649-2080), PC Recycle (13107 NE 20th, Suite-2, Bellevue, WA, 98005, 425-881-4444), George Electronix (15015 Main St #109, Bellevue, WA, 98007, 425-643-4471), and Video Only (14339 NE 20th Bellevue, WA, 98007, 425-644-9400).** Please note - drop off locations and conditions may change. Quantities accepted are limited. Please also note that computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are not included in this program but will be accepted at Bellevue's Fall 2014 Special Collection Event.

PLEASE NOTE: Fluorescent lights, tubes, bulbs, and incandescent lights are not accepted at this event. Visit the King County <http://www.takeitbacknetwork.org/> for a drop-off location.



A secured load has been fastened or attached to the vehicle with tarps, rope, straps, netting, or chains, so as to prevent any part of the load or the covering from becoming loose, detached, or leaving the vehicle while the vehicle is moving.

Rules For Latex Paint

Latex paint is no longer considered hazardous waste and the household hazardous waste facilities in Seattle and King County no longer accept it. Residents who cannot use up latex paint must dry it out or bulk it with kitty litter and put it in the garbage with the lid off. Liquid paint is not accepted as garbage. Hazardous Waste:

The Factoria Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off and other household hazardous waste facilities will accept :

- Antifreeze
- Solvents
- Fluorescent Lights - limit 10
- Pesticides/Herbicides
- Household Chemicals
- Oil Based Paint
- Motor Oil/Filters
- Batteries

The Factoria Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Service is open Tuesday - Friday from 8 am to 4 pm and Saturday - Sunday from 9 am to 5 pm (except major holidays). There is a 50 gallon limit and a gasoline limit of 30 gallons per customer per day. Customers will not get their containers back. No containers can be over five gallons in size. Separate motor (crankcase) oil from all other fluids. Pure crankcase oil containers will be returned.

Please note lines are longer on recycling event days. Plan to visit another day.
