COUNCIL BUSINESS: The Council had no regular Council meeting in August.

NEXT COUNCIL MEETING: The next regular meeting of the Town Council will be held at 7:00pm on **Tuesday, September 13, 2016** at Mayor Leider’s house. At that meeting, the Council expects to host representatives from the City of Bellevue to give a brief update on their proposals for mitigating neighborhood traffic during Sound Transit’s construction project along south Bellevue Way. Interested residents are encouraged to attend.

EAGLES: Reminders- for property owners doing any construction within 660’ of a bald eagle’s nest or roosting area, check directly with WDFW for their current requirements. Beaux Arts is home to a resident nesting pair of bald eagles raising 1-2 eaglets every spring. They have a nest in the WABA Woodlands, and their 107th nesting site is also still protected: http://www.beauxarts-wa.gov/bav_eagle_map.JPG.

MARSHAL REPORT: Bellevue Police Special Enforcement Team arrested three people suspected in a series of vehicle break-ins and auto thefts throughout the region on Aug.17th. The suspects’ details included:

- **Checking every car door handle** in every neighborhood looking for easy, unlocked access.
- **Only going into driveways with no visible cameras or open windows.**
- **Avoiding neighborhoods** where there appeared to be a **neighborhood watch.**
- **Stole cars by first breaking into them, then finding spare keys** inside the vehicle.

METRO BUS CHANGES: King County Metro is making several revisions and improvements to many routes, including some that impact riders in this area, effective 9/10/16. The new routes in this area will be in preparation for the South Bellevue Park and Ride closure to vehicles, for East Link Light Rail construction by Sound Transit. The 249 will no longer have southbound stops through Beaux Arts or Enatai, but instead have a clockwise loop going north on 104th and south on Bellevue Way, then loop north again. Look for the Orange timetables, available soon. PSE and SOUND TRANSIT: Reminder, the utility relocation project along Bellevue Way and SE 30th will continue to last through September including reduced travel lanes on 113th Ave. SE for the transmission phase in preparation of East Link construction for Sound Transit.

DOG RULES FOR BEACH: The Summer Dog Rules will **NO** longer be in effect after Monday, September 5th, however if there are swimmer using the swim beach please keep your dogs out of the way! Please follow these rules **year-round** with your dog at the beach, also posted on the WABA website, <http://waba1908.com/>:

- Dogs must be accompanied by a human at all times, be under control – voice or leash – and must not be a nuisance to other people using any part of the WABA property.
- Owners must clean up after their dogs at all times. *Pet waste* stations are located in two areas of the beach. Mitts for clean-up are provided. Please put waste in the receptacle marked “pet waste”.
- Dogs must be kept on trails while passing through the Woodlands areas. Dogs are *not* permitted to roam free in the restoration areas!

PARKING AT THE BEACH: Please make sure that your cars and those of your guests properly display a WABA sticker or guest pass. If you have replaced your vehicle or lost your sticker, please request a new one from the WABA clerk. Guest passes are \$5 to replace, stickers are free. All motorized vehicles must stay in the parking lots at either the north or south ends of the beach, and display proper WABA identification - stickers, hanging tag, or Board approved guest passes. **Reminder, Golf carts are considered motorized vehicles, and all motorized vehicle rules apply to golf carts, just like cars, while on WABA property. Golf carts are required to display a WABA sticker or guest pass to park at the beach. All Town of Beaux Arts Village ordinances apply to golf carts while on WABA property and paved roads, except that golf carts are also permitted in the unpaved/ gravel south parking lot.**

- WABA members are responsible for the behavior of their children and their guests while on the beach.
