**COUNCIL BUSINESS:** The following discussions took place at the Council’s March meeting:

- WABA Shoreline Permit: The Council reviewed and approved an application from the Western Academy seeking a Shoreline Permit for various repairs to the docks.
- Planning Commission Work on Zoning and Design Guidelines: The Council continued the discussion of this work posing questions for the Planning Commission to answer. Mayor Leider also planned to attend the March Planning Commission meeting to present the Council’s concerns.
- Certified Local Government (CLG): The Council passed Ord. No. 428, establishing the Town as a CLG and creating a tax-incentive program to encourage owners of certain historic properties to preserve those homes rather than replacing them with new construction. Planning Commission Chair Paula Dix will shepherd the legislation through various state agencies to complete the certification process.

**NEXT COUNCIL MEETING:** The next regular meeting of the Town Council will be held at 7:00pm on **Tuesday, April 11, 2017** at Mike Hillberg’s house. Interested persons are encouraged to attend.

**BELLEVUE HOV LANE:** An update from the City of Bellevue about the planned HOV Lane near the South Bellevue Park & Ride: “Thank you to those who participated in the Bellevue Way SE Southbound HOV Lane Project in-person or online open houses. More than 45 people attended the open house and over 130 people visited the website. We read and compiled your comments from the online and in person open houses. Please find the summary of the feedback on the project website at: <http://www.bellevuewa.gov/bellevue-way-hov-lane.htm>. We have considered your comments in refining the design options. We are now presenting options to the Transportation Commission and the City Council next month and expect to receive direction from the Council on how to proceed with this project.
